Guilford County has

over half a million residents contributing to its local food system. Residents of Guilford County spend 1.4 billion dollars on food each year.

However, there are approximately 24 food deserts in Guilford County. The US Department of Agriculture defines food deserts as residential areas where at least one-third of the residents live more than a mile away from a grocery store, or communities that have a poverty rate higher than 20%. Residents in these areas struggle to have fresh, healthy food on a regular basis.

In 2017 the Food Research and Action Center ranked the Greensboro/High Point metropolitan area as 14th in the United States for food hardship, up from the previous ranking of 9th. There is still a lot of room for improvement.

To build a sustainable food system that is economically viable, environmentally and socially sound we need to invest in Guilford County and our local food producers. A local food system involves more than just farms and markets, it is a complex structure of relationships and processes required in feeding members of the community. Growing, harvesting, processing, packaging, distributing, marketing, consuming, disposing and recycling all are various parts of our local food system.

Farmers earn ten to fourteen cents of every dollar you spend at the super market. The price that you pay mainly goes towards shipping, handling and marketing of the produce. Removing various middle-men gives consumers fresher, healthier produce for the same price while allowing farmers to earn upwards of eighty-five cents of every dollar.

Supporting a local food system creates new job opportunities and keeps existing farms economically viable. If consumers in Guilford County spent just 10% of their food budget on local food, it would provide approximately \$140 million a year in our local economy.



NC State University and the Center for Environmental Farming Systems (CEFS) created the NC 10% campaign to encourage consumers to commit 10 percent of their existing food dollars to support local food producers, related businesses and communities in North Carolina.

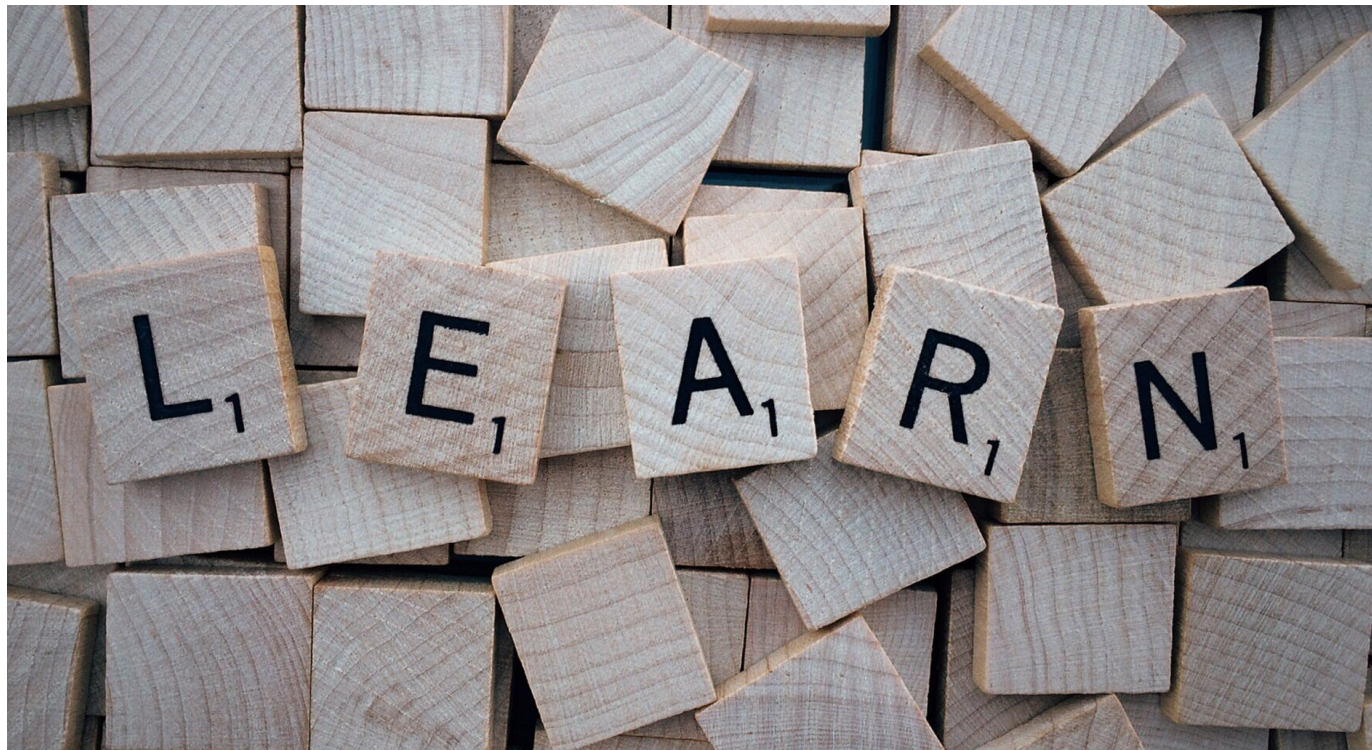

There are many methods in which our farmers market their produce. Some farms sell to local grocers, markets and restaurants; while others have their own roadside stands, sell direct from the farm, or do CSA programs.

Local Farms offer direct sales from the farm. This can be a great way to learn where your food is coming from as well as get to know the people you are supporting. If they are not busy bringing in the harvest, some farmers even give you a tour of their production. Others let you harvest your own produce, which is especially popular during strawberry season!

Community Support Agriculture (CSA) programs are share opportunities for farmers to offer to the public. Consumers can purchase a “share” at the beginning of the growing season as a way of pre-paying for their produce. As the season progresses, community members receive their portion of the produce. This helps farmers gain financial support at the beginning of the season and an opportunity to know their customers. Consumers benefit by receiving the freshest local produce available.

Farmers markets provide a great opportunity for both farmers and consumers to interact and support the local economy. They provide the opportunity for visitors to talk to farmers and try new foods while investing money back into the Greensboro/High Point food system. Farmers market vendors sell a variety of crafts, artisan foods, plants and other items. Each market is unique, check their calendars for special events, live music and activities for the whole family.

What are the Benefits of a School Garden?

- **Inquiry-based learning:** School gardens are learning labs that can enrich every part of a school's curriculum.
- **Community:** Build school pride through taking ownership. Involve whole families; this is for gardeners of all ages!
- **Health:** Kids are more likely to eat something that they have grown, and gardening exposes kids to a variety of new food! Gardening also decreases stress and increases physical activity.
- **Life Skills:** In addition to a wealth of plant growing information, gardening teaches cooperation, responsibility, perseverance, and hard work.
- **Entrepreneurship:** Some schools fundraise by selling produce or seedlings that they grow.
- **Nature:** Connect with plants, pollinators, birds, and life cycles in the garden.

Community gardens are developed plots for community members to come together to grow fruits, vegetables, flowers, herbs, and ornamental plants on common ground. The gardens help establish a sense of community, teach life skills, promote healthy living, and much more. Community gardens are found at diverse locations including parks, schools, places of worship, vacant lots, and private properties.

Most community gardens require a small fee to rent a garden plot, gardeners then plant and harvest the produce of their choice. Fresh produce, exercise, and gardening as a family activity are just some of the benefits. Garden directors are often able to give helpful insight for beginners and offer suggestions. Guilford County's community gardens are spread all across the Greensboro and High Point areas; there is probably one just around the corner from you!
